CURRENT CATALOG DESCRIPTION:

An introductory survey of Russian civilization from 1917 through the revolutionary period and Stalinism to dissidence, glasnost and the present. Topics include literature, art, music, social values and intellectual expression. Readings and discussions in English.

RATIONALE FOR CHANGE:

Certain MLLI program requirements include courses taught in the target language (Spanish, French, Russian, etc.), which is reflected in the course rubric. RUSS 271, which is taught in English, is an exception, and does not count in fulfilling “target language” requirements. The proposed change will make it easier to represent program requirements in Degree Audit. We therefore request that the cross-listing for RUSS 271 with MLL 271 be removed, and that the rubric RUSS 271 be deactivated. The course will continue to be taught as MLL 271 only.
