Rationale (see instructions):

- a) Visual Arts Core for AHMS majors: have dropped ART 220 and ART 221. The objectives and content of these courses is currently fulfilled by ART 216. These courses were primarily serving non-majors and were being taught by adjunct faculty who have now retired.
- b) This allows us to move two 300 level art history classes into the Core. The courses ART 321, 323 and 328 survey the periods of the 19th, 20th and 21st centuries.
- c) The course offerings in the concentration section covers a range of subjects and topics that students take depending on their desired track of Art History or Museum Studies.
- d) ART 329 is a topics course that is repeatable if topic varies, for a maximum of 12 credits.
- e) The Approved Electives section has been revised to match the current course offerings in the College of Arts, Humanities and Social Sciences. The chairs of the respective departments have been notified that these course are listed in our advising form.
- f) There is NO CHANGE in the number of required credits (60 credits).
