RATIONALE FOR CHANGE:

The current description has no real content. We also prefer that our second 300 level Topics in Philosophy (we also offer PHIL 399 as Topics in Philosophy) not have such an awkward ("b") course number as 399b – so we are requesting the change to PHIL 398. At the 400 level, we also have PHIL 498 and PHIL 499 as distinct Advanced Topics in Philosophy courses. We find it necessary to have two such courses available at both the 300 and 400 level in order to accommodate course innovation. (For example, in Spring 2016 we are offering all of PHIL 399, PHIL 399b, PHIL 498 and PHIL 499. None of these topic courses can be accommodated in our other existing courses.)
