## **RATIONALE FOR CHANGE:**

Certain MLLI program requirements include courses taught in the target language (Spanish, French, Russian, etc.), which is reflected in the course rubric. RUSS 270, which is taught in English, is an exception, and does not count in fulfilling "target language" requirements. The proposed change will make it easier to represent program requirements in Degree Audit. We therefore request that the cross-listing for RUSS 270 with MLL 270 be removed, and that the rubric RUSS 270 be deactivated. The course will continue to be taught as MLL 270 only.
