CURRENT CATALOG DESCRIPTION:

A continuation of the process of developing an aesthetic sense of lighting design. Projects involve working from a script through the conceptual process to the final product - complete lighting designs for production. Repeat students will complete highly complex design assignments involving work in special effects, timing and executing lighting movement sequences.

This advanced course further develops the aesthetic and technical skills of lighting design. Projects involve working from a script through the conceptual process to complete lighting designs for production. RATIONALE FOR CHANGE:

The changes for this course align its requirements directly with the other Advanced Design content areas. This course should be done only in sequence following the successful completion of THTR 235 with a C or better to enable the sequence of learning to be built upon previous instruction. The course's repeatability allows for dedicated, advanced students to repeat the course to further advance training and preparation to the profession. The course catalog description change is to align this course with its counterparts in the other Advanced Design courses and clarify its sentence structure.
