CURRENT CATALOG DESCRIPTION:

This course offers an investigation of current directions in animation and interactive media. Topics to be announced. This course is repeatable up to 9 credits or 3 attempts.

This course prepares Animation students for their capstone ART489 Senior Projects course. Students will develop individual project ideas and prepare for production using traditional and/or non-traditional pre-production practices. Emphasis will be on class presentations, discussion, critiques, and screenings.

RATIONALE FOR CHANGE:

ART487 (Experimental Interfaces) has not been taught in over a decade. The course number is an appropriate level for Pre-production for Animation Senior Projects. Animation students have struggled for years to complete a high-quality capstone project in one semester. Because animation production is extremely time-intensive, sufficient

preproduction is needed. This course supports students in a semester of preproduction, better preparing them for a successful capstone project.
