A different topic will be announced each semester the course is offered. The seminar is designed to develop research and analytical skills specific to this area, and students will have the opportunity to do original research. This course is repeatable up to 6 credits or 2 attempts.

RATIONALE FOR CHANGE:

We are removing the prerequisite requirement of AMST 300 for all Department of American Studies 400-level seminars. Requiring AMST 300 (a methods course primarily for AMST majors) limits access to students from other departments or programs adding AMST 400-level seminars, like AMST 420, without instructor permission.

In addition the course description in the catalog was for AMST 430 rather than AMST 420. This change will correct the mistake.
