This course is a continuation of ANTH 401H. This course is repeatable.

This course is the second in a two-course individual study sequence, which begins with ANTH 491H. Together, these courses lead towards fulfilling the requirements of the departmental Honors Program in Anthropology. During this sequence, the student completes an original research project leading to an Honors Thesis under the supervision of two full-time faculty members in the department who serve as the Honors Committee.

## **RATIONALE FOR CHANGE:**

<u>Course Number</u>: We recently became aware that this course number is the same number (ANTH 402H) as one cross-listed course with MLL as Ethnography of Communication. We are therefore asking to change this course number.

Course Title: We are proposing the update in order to clarify that this is a two-part sequence.

<u>Prerequisites:</u> We are raising the grade required in the first part of the two-course sequence to a B to ensure that students are prepared to continue this independent research project, and we are updating the number for the first part of the sequence from 401H to what is now 491H.

<u>Repeatability</u>: The previous description indicated that this course is repeatable for credit, which it should not be.

<u>Grading Method:</u> We are not sure what grading methods were allowed before, but this should only be Regular Grading (A-F) since this course would only be used to meet the requirement for the departmental Honors Program.
