### Rationale (see instructions):

The Visual Arts department is requesting to have Art 220-Art History I and Art 221-Art History II inactivated from the undergraduate course catalog, because these two courses are not offered on a regular basis. This inactivation would impact all undergraduate visual arts students with degrees in the BA and BFA; in addition to all areas of concentration and minors. The presence of them in the course catalog, causes confusion for current and prospective undergraduate visual arts students, and we want to eliminate that confusion by inactivation of the two courses. This change will not cause any issues based on them being inactivated. In the event that an issue should arise, the department can submit course substitutions. There is no change in the required credits with the inactivation of the two courses.
