#### Rationale (see instructions):

a. What are the major departures from the current structure?

The major departure from the current structure refers to the entrepreneurship-infused elective courses of the ENTR Minor. We are not cross-listing the electives to be counted as part of the ENTR Minor. Instead, we use them (with permission from the offering departments) with their existing designation. These courses have been approved to be used as electives for the ENTR Minor by the ENTR Minor Committee. Courses with a single or multiple sections are accepted "as is" as electives in the ENTR Minor. The chair of the offering department approves these courses to be counted as part of the requirements for the ENTR Minor. See Appendix A containing approvals from the chairs of the above departments. See Appendix B for highlighted justification of entrepreneurial content in course syllabi of proposed courses. See Appendix C for all courses which already have "Entrepreneurship" mentioned in the title and/or in the current UMBC Undergraduate catalog description (syllabi for these courses are not included in this package). The catalog description is included.

b) Why is the new structure preferable?

The new structure provides minimal overhead to be implemented; in addition, the offering departments maintain total control of their courses.

- c) What provisions will be made to accommodate current students if courses are discontinued? Since these electives are owned by various departments, the ENTR Minor committee has no control on offering, canceling, or discontinuing an elective course. This issue falls under the responsibility of the offering department.
- d) If there is a change in required credits, please provide a specific justification for that change. There are no changes in the credit structure of the ENTR Minor.
