CURRENT CATALOG DESCRIPTION:

Writing for Media Arts - An introduction to a range of methodologies for developing ideas, scripts and structural tactics for short films and videos. Emphasis will be placed on traditional storytelling strategies, as well as experimental scripting and alternative notational techniques.

RATIONALE FOR CHANGE: 1. By taking ART 347 earlier in the major or minor sequence, we hope to increase the possibility that students will have the opportunity to produce works based on scripts written in this class once they enroll in more advanced production classes such as ART 315 (narrative production)

- 2. Students need to take a script writing course earlier in their progression through our program so that they can a) increase their writing skills as soon as possible and b) so that we can consider offering an advanced writing course, which students have regularly expressed interest in taking.
- 3. For our majors and minors: We need students to have enough room in their curriculum to take ART 347 and ART 342 one year apart. Since both are WI courses, it can be often problematic for students to take both classes the same semester, a situation that happens frequently under the current structure of pre-requisites.
- 4. This would open up the course to any interested student at the University. We have found that many non-majors ask to take this course. Non Cinematic Arts and Animation major/minors would need permission from Instructor.
