Rationale (see instructions):

The Department proposes this change in order to clarify that we do not teach, nor does there exist, only one specific dance technique called "contemporary." Current teaching practice often includes skills from several different established dance techniques (for example, Graham technique, Limon technique, Horton technique, somatic-based technique, release technique, Cunningham technique, and more). The Department shifts course content among these techniques and others, by either teaching one technique for part of a semester, and another technique for another part of a semester, or by teaching a 'fusion' class that combines and draws from multiple techniques, depending on the level of the class. This change in title better communicates that students should expect to learn a variety of techniques in each class, rather than one.
