Briefly explain the need for this proposal. For changes in program requirements, explain

a) What are the major departures from the current structure and why is the new structure preferable?

We propose to remove the 3 core requirements for the minor, as these courses are no longer taught in any of the affiliated departments. Instead, we will allow students to choose their 18 credits from the approved list of courses, based on the criteria listed above (2 from HIST, 1 ANCS/JDST, 1 from ANTH/AFST, 2 additional electives).

This new format will be similar to the current Medieval and Early Modern Studies (MEMS) minor, which gives students more flexibility to choose courses that are regularly offered from affiliated departments. This change allows students to reliably plan for the minor.

In addition, students will also learn a range of methodological approaches to studying religion. This structure takes advantage of the interdisciplinary nature of the minor and emphasizes that students should acquire a regional/topical breadth of knowledge.

b) What provisions will be made to accommodate current students if courses are discontinued?

This structure will provide both more reliability and more flexibility to students. Reworking the approved course list allows us to guarantee that we are guiding minors towards courses that are taught regularly. By allowing students to choose from a range of courses within each criteria, we cover for any variation in different departments' teaching schedules

c) If there is a change in required credits, please provide a specific justification for that change.

We propose to remove the following three requirements:

- RLST 100 Historical Dimensions of Religion (3.00)
- RLST 200 Philosophy Of Religion (3.00)
- RLST 349 The Sociology of Religion (3.00)

These three required classes have not been taught in many semesters and the affiliated departments do not currently have instructors who teach these classes. The chairs for the respective cross-listed departments have all agreed to remove them as required credits, as we do not have the ability to offer these in rotation regularly enough to allow students to plan for them.

In addition, the following courses will become inactive, based on approval from respective department chairs:

- RLST 203 Earliest Christianity (3.0)
- RLST 351 New Testament Greek (3.0)
- RLST 352 Septuagint (3.0)
- RLST 473 Mahatma Gandhi's Political Experiments with Truth (3.0)
