The saga of introducing the new history courses may now be coming to an end, but I need your approval for some minor changes to the courses.

We have made small changes in the HIST classes' recommended preparation (deleted HIST 100 and HIST 111; added ANCS 201 (Greek) or ANCS 202 (Roman) and ARCH 200 (Greek) or ARCH 201 (Roman). We have also eliminated the P/F option from the courses and added verbs to the course descriptions so that all sentences are complete.

I am attaching the change to existing course forms to this message. If you approve these changes, could you reply to that effect as soon as possible? The proposals come before the UGC on Thursday.
