a) What are the major departures from the current structure and why is the new structure preferable? Music education students will have the option to either take MUSC 225 and 226, which largely presents music theory concepts from a Western Classical Music perspective and is the only current option, or take MUSC 221 and 222, which enable students to learn jazz theory and arranging. Instrumental music educators can benefit from being able to engage K-12 students in jazz theoretical perspectives.

b) What provisions will be made to accommodate current students if courses are discontinued? MUSC 225 and 226 remain an option for instrumental music education majors, so there is no need for any accommodations.
